EXPERIENCES

THE WILDLIFE EXPERIENCE:

The Northern Conservancies are host to over 70 species of mammals including some of the world's rarest animals, such as, white rhino (at the Rhino Sanctuary on the edge of the Kileleoni Hill), wild dog, leopard, cheetah and lion. For keen ornithologists, the area is home to over 350 species of birds. The Maasai Mara is one of the most important areas for biodiversity in the world, where the diversity of wildlife is higher than in any other part in Africa. We follow a strict Code of Conduct in the Northern Mara Conservancies, where wildlife takes priority and sightings never have more than 5 cars.

FULL-DAY SAFARI:

A picnic breakfast and lunch down in the Mara Reserve departing after enjoying sunrise in your room.

MORNING SAFARI:

Explore the conservancies in the Northern Mara, departing just before sunrise with a picnic breakfast and back at the lodge by lunch.

AFTERNOON SAFARI:

After tea and snacks, head out on a game drive with a sundowner stop on the plains or on the edge of the hill, back in time for supper.

GUIDES

Our guides are all from the area and have been trained by Eco Training. They are part of our family, and their main aim is to make sure you see some incredible sightings, have a fun safari and take home great memories.

CAMERA HIRE:

We have 2 cameras for hire in our photostudio.

WILD PHOTOSHOOTS:

Enjoy a photoshoot at the lodge and surrounding environs, by the Mara River, out on the plains.

THE WILD DUKA

Located at House in the Wild and carefully curated for browsing and shopping delight. We stock exclusive African artefacts, Kenyan Clothing, accessories and crafts as well as hand-made originals from our beading station.

WILD CUISINE:

Our menus are inspired by the finest, freshest ingredients we can source locally and sustainably. Most of our salads and vegetables are grown in the Wild Shamba. We also support farmers who grow their produce ethically we try and limit packaging by buying straight from the farms.


FUTURES IN THE WILD TOUR:

Visit to our Mara Training Centre founded by Tarquin and Lippa Wood. It is a hub of creativity, storytelling, teaching and sharing, where you can learn about rangeland management and our efforts to work with local communities to restore and maintain the natural environment through Sustainable Rangeland Management. Meet the team behind the Women in the Wild, where you may find them beading, soap making, candle making or planting seedlings. THE BEADING STATION:

At the Mara Training Centre, you will find the Beading Station, an innovative space bringing our community and guests together in a creative and interactive environment.

THE WILD SHAMBA:

Please be sure to visit our lovely one acre vegetable garden, known in Swahili as a shamba.

TREE PLANTING:

Meet the women who run the Trees in the Wild nursery and plant a tree while visiting the Wild Shamba.

RUNNING

Stretch your legs and go for a run with one of our team.

E BIKING:

We have a range of mountain e-bikes and for those guests seeking adventure. The area provides perfect terrain for adrenaline-fuelled riding. Our bikes give guests the opportunity to ride at their own pace surrounded by nature or experience rural Africa landscapes across the Emarti Bridge.

SPA TREATMENTS:

Throughout the day, our guests can enjoy massages and treatments at our Wild Spa.

VISIT THE CATTLE MARKET:

Visit a vibrant and buzzing atmosphere and a slice of real life in the Maasai Mara.

SUNDOWNERS:

Drive out onto the plains or on to the edge of the hill where you can sit, press reset and watch the best show on earth as the sun sets across the Mara Plains.

HELI TRIPS

Visit the shores of Lake Natron and stop off for a picnic lunch in a waterfall in the Loita forests, or pop down to the Mara Triangle in 15 mins where we can arrange a car to meet you. (Must be arranged in advance).

GO FISH:

Have a go after a morning game drive or over sunset on the edge of the Mara River fishing for catfish. If you catch it, take a picture and release it!

VISIT THE RHINO SANCTUARY:

Guests are able to walk with the rhino, while being protected by armed rangers. Get a selfie with a rhino?

HOT-AIR BALLOONING:

Something on the busketlist! Leave early and enjoy an incredible experience of floating over the Mara at dawn, landing for a champagne breakfast on the plains.

LODGE GAMES:

Enjoy the vast lawns and spaces, play badminton, ping pong, volley ball against the team. Try your hand at archery with our Maasai guides.















Horses in the Wild has a herd of 16 beautiful and well-trained safari horses housed at the Mara Training Centre, our headquarters.

Our gentle, experienced horses are ready to provide guests with an unforgettable experience, offering a unique perspective of thestunning African landscape while interacting with wildlife.

Rides are best enjoyed early in the morning, culminating in a delightful champagne breakfast, or in the afternoon, ending with refreshing sundowners.


















THE WILD HUB

As a hub of innovation, education, and community collaboration, this unique space embodies our commitment to redefining the relationship between humanity and the wild.




